Wentworth Falls Football Club (WFFC) is launching an educational series aimed at minimizing injuries, fostering a proactive mindset, and promoting proper nutrition. The event is scheduled to run ahead of the 2025 winter season. This initiative has been made feasible through a Growing Football grant secured by the club. Stay tuned for the announcement of dates.

On May 18th, Wentworth Falls Football Club (WFFC) hosted the Sparrows Unity Cup, featuring thrilling matches between Hazelbrook Football Club and WFFC's female players. Children enjoyed Shelley's face painting, bubble soccer, and an inflatable dart board provided by Football NSW, while spectators and parents watched from the sidelines with hot beverages and delicious tacos.

The tournament showcased the top senior and junior female players from each club, resulting in exciting games that saw WFFC secure victories in both categories. This event provided a fantastic platform for both clubs to highlight local talent, drawing a large crowd despite the cold winter weather. Looking ahead, WFFC plans to schedule next year's event for October to avoid the colder weather.

In honour of Leah Blayney's significant contributions to the club, WFFC introduced the Leah Blayney Award, personally presented by Leah to Aleesha Naumann for her outstanding performance. The event attracted various dignitaries, including Linda Cerone from Nepean Football Association, Romola Hollywood, Darren Rodrigo, Trish Doyle, and Susan Templeman, who assisted in distributing other awards and medals.



The all-abilities team, The Blue Kangaroos, from Hazelbrook Football Club also participated in a game against our U9 mixed team, with both sides delivering commendable performances. We look forward to their participation again next year, as it can be challenging for all-abilities teams to find suitable competitions. The Sparrows Unity Cup provided a crucial opportunity for these players to engage in a competition.

The Sparrows Unity Cup holds immense significance for WFFC, symbolizing years of dedication from committee members to enhance female participation and retention in the sport. From 17% female players in 2019 to 28% today, this growth reflects the concerted efforts of volunteers who have fostered a safe and inclusive environment for female footballers. WFFC aims to leverage this event to further inspire excitement and engagement, contributing to the recruitment and retention of female players. Increasing the number of female teams in the Blue Mountains will reduce travel distances. benefiting local players. Moreover, the Unity Cup strengthened ties with Hazelbrook Football Club, fostering collaboration towards shared objectives during the event.

WENTWORTH FALLS SUMMER FOOTBALL 24/25



WENTWORTH FALLS WILL BE RUNNING ITS ANNUAL SUMMER 7ASIDE COMPETITION AT PITT PARK.

The summer football season will span from October 4, 2024, to the end of February 2025, including a Christmas break from December 20, 2024, to January 17, 2025.

Junior sessions for ages 5-15 will take place on Friday nights from 4-6pm. Adult sessions, open to females aged 15+ and males aged 16+, will run on Friday nights from 6-10pm.

Costs:

- \$70 per player for ages 5-9.
- \$95 per player for ages 10-15.
- \$120 per player for 15-year-old girls in the junior category.
- \$145 per player for females aged 15+ and males aged 16+ participating in the senior category.

Registration is open to both individuals and teams this season, and will be managed through Dribl.

DECISION MAKING

Match day is a special place for players as they should be allowed to make decisions in the game without constant coaching hence why WFFC, all the way up to the FFA support the Shoosh for Kids Protocol (www.sport.nsw.gov.au/shoosh-for-kids). At WFFC we aim to coach in a way that teaches players which skill to use when they see certain cues on the field. The process is outlined in the FFA national coaching curriculum as PERCEPTION -DECISION - EXECUTION. The player sees something happen, decides what they need to do, and then executes that skill. That is why we ask that coaches, managers and parents all allow players during their game to practice this whole process without being constantly told what to do, as we feel decision making is an important skill for people of all ages to learn, and can have a broader, positive impact on their lives.



FOOTBALL IS A GAME ABOUT SPACE.

We want to move into space where possible, play the ball to players in space, and sometimes even make a run to draw a defender with you to open up space for another player on your team. Teams that shut down space for the opposition and open up space when they are in attack are usually the ones that come out on top.





POSSESSION

In the modern game possession is key - which in football means being in control of the ball. It is important that players can identify when their team has possession of the ball, and when they have lost it, as their required actions are different for each situation. It also gives players a constant task when they don't have the ball, as they should always be watching to see who is in control of the ball, and whether they need to transition to either an offensive or defensive state.




